# **Policies, Procedures & Rules** (Revised 4/6/17, new revisions in bold)

#### I. ORGANIZATION:

The McHenry Girls Basketball League is a high school feeder league for girls basketball in grades 5th through 8th. We are a private voluntary organization, and not publicly funded; we are not subject to Title IX regulations.

#### II. ADMINISTRATIVE:

Each district shall appoint a league representative. The league will maintain an Executive Board made up of league representatives to decide issues that may arise. Direct all concerns, problems or inquires to your league representative first. If a resolution is not reached then the Executive Board may be contacted for a ruling. Game protests should be filed through a member of the Executive Board. Protests must be filed within 24 hours after the game in question.

# III. ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

Age Requirement: Players must play in the Grade that they currently attend school in. Players are allowed to play up in higher Grades but may not play down into a lower Grade. In addition, the following age limitations are in force:

The age eligibility date for the 2017 season shall be December 31, 2016.

5th Grade players shall not reach her 12th birthday before this date

6th Grade players shall not reach her 13th birthday before this date

7th Grade players shall not reach her 14th birthday before this date

8th Grade players shall not reach her 15th birthday before this date

**Residency:** No player shall be allowed to play if she lives outside of the high school district that her team represents. Each district must enforce this rule to the best of their ability. Any exceptions to this rule must get approval from the League Executive Board before players are added to rosters.

#### IV. OFFICIATING:

Only IHSA or WIAA registered ("patched") officials should officiate the basketball games. An exception is 5th grade games, where refs who help teach are encouraged and patched referees are not required.

## V. ROSTERS:

All team rosters should be turned into the league representatives prior to the first game. Failure to turn in a roster may result in forfeiture of games. No feeder team shall have more than one roster, i.e. tourney team and a feeder team. Rosters shall only contain players that live within the high school district that the feeder team represents.

#### VI. LEAGUE RULES:

- 1. League starting date is the first weekend in April; league end date is the second weekend in June.
- 2. Games should be confirmed via phone call/e-mail with the opposing team the week prior to a game. Confirmation of games prevents scheduling mishaps and accommodates the inevitable scheduling changes.
- 3. Game management is the responsibility of the home team. Unless previously arranged, the home team shall be responsible for arranging referees, providing a timekeeper & scorekeeper, and keeping the game scorebook.

- 4. Unless otherwise stated herein, all rules of National Federation of High School Athletics (NFHA) are to be followed and adhered to.
- 5. Team rosters shall have no more than 15 players. All players suited must play in the game, unless injured. Players may play up in grade, but not down. For example, a 7th grade player may play for the 8th grade, but never in a 6th grade game.
- 6. Uniforms shall adhere to NFHA guidelines. Uniforms shall have clearly visible numbers on both front and back. Number height shall be a minimum 8 inches in back and 4 inches in front.
- 7. A regulation girls (28.5" circumference) ball shall be used for all games.
- 8. Only man-to-man defense shall be played at the 5th, 6th and 7th grade levels. Zone defense may be played as an option at the 8th grade level without advanced notice to the opposing team.
- 9. A full court zone or man-to-man press is allowed in the backcourt. The pressing team must return to man-to-man defense once the offensive team has crossed the half-court line for the 6th and 7th grade levels. No pressing at all is allowed at the 5<sup>th</sup> grade level.
- 10. No press defenses with a 15 point or greater lead, 10 point lead or greater at the 6<sup>th</sup> grade level
- 11. Half-court pressing in the forecourt is not allowed, although double-teaming out of a man-to-man defense is allowed.
- 12. Three point shots are awarded anytime at all grade levels.
- 13. Quarters are 7 minutes for 5th, 6th, 7th and 8th grades.
- 14. In the event of a tie game at the end of regulation there shall be a 2 minute overtime. Possession at start of overtime shall be determined by a jump ball. Teams shall be awarded one additional full timeout per overtime period.
- 15. Halftime shall be 5 minutes in duration.

## 16. Special rules for 5th Grade ONLY:

- a. At the 5th grade level ONLY the defensive team shall stay behind a line extended from the top of the arc to each sideline for 5 seconds after the offensive team crosses the half court line, or until the offense penetrates that same line. After the 5 seconds the defensive team may step up and play normal man-to-man defense. This is done to help 5th grade teams get a half-court offense set in place without defensive pressure. Coaches are encouraged to review this rule with the referee and each other prior to the start of the game.
- b. No pressing at all allowed at 5th grade level
- c. The lane rule is 5 seconds instead of 3.
- 17. Teams will not be credited with a win unless the scores are promptly reported through the website e-mail link or other appropriate means. It is recommended that both teams report their scores, regardless whether they were Home or Away.
- 18. Recommended scheduling: Weekday games  $5th \rightarrow 6th \rightarrow 7th \rightarrow 8th$ Weekend games  $8th \rightarrow 7th \rightarrow 6th \rightarrow 5th$
